

Dear AEA Member,

We have very important Primary Elections for Alpine School Board taking place this June. It is crucial that all our members turn out and vote for candidates who are Public Education friendly and who are supportive of teachers in ASD. The school board elections have a direct impact on your career and influence what happens to you every day in the district.

We need every ASD employee, their families, their friends, and neighbors to vote for the best candidates for our school district. The ASD school board election is a NON-PARTISAN election, so everyone registered to vote can vote even if they do not have a political party affiliation. Please encourage everyone you know to vote.

The Primary election takes place on Tuesday June 28, 2022. The mail-in ballots will begin to be sent out on June 7, 2022, and the last day to request a mail-in ballot is June 21 at 5 pm. All ballots must be postmarked by June 28, 2022. (Postage is not necessary, just fill it out and put it in a mailbox)

The AEA Political Action Committee sent out questionnaires and tried to interview all candidates running for ASD School Board in 2022. After reading through their questionnaire answers and in-person interviews the AEA PAC is recommending candidates for each seat as listed below. Some races we have dual candidates recommended due to both candidates fitting the criteria of being Public Education friendly and supportive of teachers in ASD.

Alpine Seat 1 - Julie King (unopposed; Incumbent)

Alpine Seat 2 - Wendy Rencher

Alpine Seat 2 - Joylin Lincoln

\*new seat after redistricting this year

Alpine Seat 4 - Amber Bonner (Incumbent)

Alpine Seat 4 - Sarah Beeson (Incumbent)

\*Due to redistricting for each seat Amber and Sarah are now in the same seat

Alpine Seat 7 - Ada Wilson (Incumbent)

Alpine Seat 7 - Karsten Walker
